

PSALM 119:113-120 SECTION 15 STUDY PLAN

During this 2-week period, complete the 10 study plans below. We suggest focusing on one study plan per day. Use the days of margin as needed.



Day 1

MEET... with God through prayer.

MEDITATE... Read Psalm 119:113-120 in the NASB. Read Psalm 119:113-120 in at least two other versions of Scripture. Make notes about word variations that catch your attention. Then journal your first impressions of Section 15. **MEMORIZE...** Select which verses in this section you will memorize during this 2-week period. Get started.

Day 2

MEET... with God through prayer.

MEDITATE... Copy Psalm 119:113-120 in the NASB on the left side of your paper. Then, on the right-hand side, beside your copy of the NASB, copy Psalm 119:113-120 from another version of choice. Underline words that seem powerful to you in either version, and then journal thoughts and impressions as you compare the different ways they are expressed. **MEMORIZE...** Review. Add. Review. AND... also take time to review what you memorized in earlier Sections.

Day 3

MEET... with God through prayer.

MEDITATE... Read through Psalm 119:113-120 and write down every statement which includes one of the variation titles of God's Word (ex. Verse 113 – "I love Your Law...") After doing so, in light of what these titles mean (see Psalm 119 Glossary), consider the distinctions of these statements and journal your thoughts and impressions.

MEMORIZE... Review. Add. Review.

Note:

David makes some very strong statements in this section. We hear these statements as declarations, prayers and observations. These will be our focus of meditation over the next four days.

Day 4

MEET... with God through prayer.

MEDITATE... Our meditation today will center on six declarations that David makes in this section about God and about His Word. Using the NASB, find and copy each of these six declarations in verses 113, 114, 119 and 120. Also review their wording found in other translations. Then, journal about the following: Can I personally make each one of these same declarations? For each one, if your answer is yes, rejoice! If your answer is no, turn that declaration into a written prayer for yourself. And if you have questions, ask God about them in your prayer, and perhaps seek out the counsel of a trusted sister in Christ or mentor.

MEMORIZE... Review. Add. Review. AND... remember to review earlier Sections as well.

Day 5

MEET... with God through prayer.

MEDITATE... Our meditation today will center on two declarations that David makes in this section regarding people. Using the NASB, find and copy both of these declarations in verses 113 and 115. Also review their wording found in other translations. Then, journal about the following: What does it mean to be "doubleminded" and what might that look like in a person's life? Why might David "hate those who are doubleminded." How do you personally regard "doubleminded" people? And do you sometimes see this trait in yourself? If so, in what ways? In verse 115, we hear David declare, "depart from me evildoers." Why might he say this? And why might this also be a good thing for us to say as well?

MEMORIZE... Review. Add. Review.

Day 6

MEET... with God through prayer.

MEDITATE... Our meditation today will center on four strong prayers that David boldly prayed in this section. Using the NASB, find and copy all four of these prayers in verses 116 and 117. Also review their wording found in other translations. Then, journal about the following: Using David's words as prayer starters, expound on each of his strong prayers, personally making them your own.

MEMORIZE... Review. Add. Review. AND... remember to review earlier Sections as well.

Day 7

MEET... with God through prayer.

MEDITATE... Our meditation today will center on three observations that David makes in this section regarding God's response to, or view of people who do not follow Him. Using the NASB, find and copy all three of these observations in verses 118 and 119. Also review their wording found in other translations. Then, journal about the following: What might motivate people to "wander from God's statutes?" What might motivate you to "wander from God's statutes?" According to God's opinion, David observed that "deceitfulness is useless," and yet, many still wander into deception. What about you? Have you ever been deceived and later realized how "useless" that deception was? Describe your experience. What does the metaphor, "You have removed all the wicked from the earth like dross" mean? And finally, what do all three of these observations stir in your own heart in regard to your relationship with God? MEMORIZE... Review. Add. Review. AND... just a reminder, the earlier Sections need review too.

Day 8

MEET... with God through prayer.

MEDITATE... Watch the video we've titled, Psalm 119:113-120, AAB Section 15, taking notes as you do. After watching, give this section a title.

MEMORIZE... Review. Add. Review.

Day 9

MEET... with God through prayer.

MEDITATE... Using the four steps shared during Introduction Week about praying Scripture, pray through this Section, Psalm 119:113-120 for yourself.

MEMORIZE... Review. Add. Review.

Day 10

MEET... with God through prayer.

MEDITATE... Using the four steps shared during Introduction Week about praying Scripture, pray through this Section, Psalm 119:113-120 for a family member or friend.

MEMORIZE... Review. Share the verses you have memorized in some way.

*Extra Suggestion for Study of Psalm 119

REVIEW... Section 4 and revisit the things God showed you through your meditation of it. Would you still give it the same title? Why?
