



PSALM 119:17-24 SECTION 3 STUDY PLAN

During this 2-week period, complete the 10 study plans below.

We suggest focusing on one study plan per day.

Use the days of margin as needed.



Day 1

MEET... with God through prayer.

MEDITATE... Read Psalm 119:17-24 in the NASB. Read Psalm 119:17-24 in at least two other versions of Scripture. Make notes about word variations that catch your attention.

MEMORIZE... Select which verses in this section you will memorize during this 2-week period. Get started.

Day 2

MEET... with God through prayer.

MEDITATE... Copy Psalm 119:17-24 in the NASB on the left side of your paper. Then, on the right-hand side, beside your copy of the NASB, copy Psalm 119:17-24 from another version of choice. Underline words that seem powerful to you in either version and journal thoughts and impressions as you compare the different ways they are expressed. Then journal David's prayer from these verses, putting it into your own words.

MEMORIZE... Review. Add. Review. AND... also take time to review what you memorized in Sections 1 and 2!

Day 3

MEET... with God through prayer.

MEDITATE... Read through Psalm 119:17-24 and write down every statement which includes one of the variation titles of God's Word (ex. Verse 22 – "*I observe Your testimonies*"). After doing so, in light of what these titles mean (see Psalm 119 Glossary), consider the distinctions of these statements and journal your thoughts and impressions.

MEMORIZE... Review. Add. Review.

Day 4

MEET... with God through prayer.

MEDITATE... Read through Psalm 119:17-24, making note of everything said about God. Remember to look beyond the surface, because while a statement may not directly be about God, it still might reveal something about Him. Journal thoughts about what you discover.

MEMORIZE... Review. Add. Review. AND... remember to review Sections 1 and 2 as well.

Day 5

MEET... with God through prayer.

MEDITATE... In Psalm 119:17-24, David prays, asking God for four things. Using the NASB version, find these four requests and write them down. Then, compare the wording of other versions to help you meditate upon each of David's requests and what his motives might be in asking God for them. Consider how these prayers of David might also express your own desires and requests or inspire some requests from your heart. Journal your thoughts.

MEMORIZE... Review. Add. Review.

Day 6

MEET... with God through prayer.

MEDITATE... Today you will need your Psalm 119 Glossary to assist you in clearly distinguishing some of the title words of God's Word. Using the NASB version, write down each statement David makes about God's Law in Section 3. (Reminder... God's Law includes multiple variations, as noted in your Glossary.) After writing them down, journal about the following questions: (v.18) What is something wonderful God has revealed to me in His Law? (v.20) What is an ordinance of God that I long to see at all times? (v.21) What is a commandment of God that I have wandered away from... and what has resulted from my wandering? (v.23) How do I elevate the statutes of God above the words of exalted people around me?
