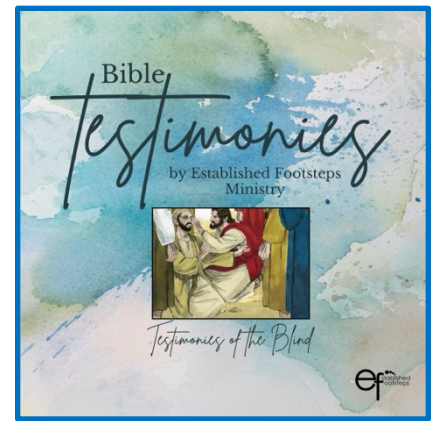

EF QUESTIONS

Day 8

In John 9, we read about Jesus healing the man born blind. What stands out most to you in his testimony? Why? Also... meditate upon and journal on the following: the varying responses he received from people when Jesus healed him (neighbors, Pharisees, parents), his own response to his healing, and Jesus healing his sight both spiritually and physically. Then, consider personal challenges you were “born into,” and how Jesus’ touch upon them could impact you.

Day 9

In Mark 10, we read of Jesus healing blind Bartimaeus. What stands out the most to you in his testimony? Why? Zoom in close and journal on the following: the obstacles Bartimaeus faced, the expressions of faith that he displayed, and Jesus’ responses to him. Then, consider personal obstacles you may be facing as you seek a touch from Jesus, and what you can learn from Bartimaeus’ testimony.

Day 10

In Acts 9, we read of Jesus healing the temporary physical blindness, but really the spiritual blindness of Saul who later became Paul. What stands out the most to you in his testimony? Why? Also, meditate upon and journal on the following: why Jesus blinded Saul instead of healing his spiritual blindness immediately, what Saul may have learned during the three days of his blindness and fasting, how Ananias was used by God to restore his sight. Then, consider your own spiritual blindness, and how God might want to use someone in your life to “restore your sight.”

Day 11

List and compare the different ways that Jesus healed each of these blind people. What do you learn about Jesus from their testimonies? How do their testimonies both challenge and encourage your faith?

Which one of these testimonies will you focus on in creating your own questions? Why?
